Travelling through Innsbruck by public transport:

Even though you can reach a lot of places in Innsbruck on foot, we provide an overview of the various tickets. Tickets can be purchased online at (<https://tickets.ivb.at/en/ticket/offer>) or directly at the IVB, IVB Customer Centre, Stainergasse


- Weekly ticket Innsbruck 26,80€
- 24h ticket Innsbruck 7€
- 8-trip ticket Innsbruck 18,40€
- Single ticket Innsbruck 3,20€

The fastest connection from the city centre to the **University of Teacher Education (PH Tirol)** is tram 1, which has a stop in Museumsstraße or Maria Theresienstraße. Exit point:

Stubaitalbahnhof

From the main railway station to the University of Teacher Education: Stubaitalbus 590a or 590b (bus stop directly in front of the station) Exit point: Wilten Basilica, walk right into Pastorstraße.

The bus leaves every 30 minutes, e.g., 07:05, 07:35, 08:05, 08:35 etc.



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Shopping tips:

- **Swarovski Innsbruck Kristallwelten Store**, Herzog-Friedrich-Straße 39, in the historic old town and in the immediate neighborhood of the Golden Roof, the store is in one of the oldest and most beautiful buildings in Innsbruck's old town.
- **Kaufhaus Tyrol**, Maria Theresienstraße: shopping mall, in 2011 named one of Europe's best and most beautiful shopping malls.
- **RathausGalerien**, Maria Theresienstraße: the Town Hall Galeries complex combines a very wide range of functions such as city administration and policy, shopping Centre, catering and hotel industry. Glass-covered shopping arcades!

Sights and culture:

- **Triumphal Arch**: Empress Maria-Theresa ordered the construction of the Arch to mark the wedding of her son and a Spanish Princess in 1765
- **Wilten Basilica** (nearby to the Pädagogische Hochschule!) is regarded as the most beautiful Rococo church in the country.
- **Tirol Panorama**: the museum houses the Giant panoramic painting which shows the Tyrolean freedom struggle of 1809, opened from Wednesday to Monday 09:00 to 17:00

In the Centre:

- **Golden Roof**: Emperor Maximilian I had the Golden Roof built in 1500 as an alcove balcony from where he could enjoy a magnificent view of the square outside.
- **Cathedral of St. James**: the present building dates from 1717-1724 and is one of the most important Baroque churches in Tyrol. The most important work of art is the famous painting „Maria Hilf“ by Lucas Cranach the Elder.
- **Imperial Palace**: Maria Theresia had the late medieval castle rebuilt in the mid-18th century. For Empress Elisabeth, popularly known as Sisi, the imperial apartments were furnished in Rococo Style.
- **Court Church**, opened daily from 09:00 to 17:00, entrance through the „Volkskundemuseum“: during his lifetime Emperor Maximilian I commissioned the casting of larger-than-life statues to decorate his tomb. In fact, 28 bronze statues were completed. The Court Church was not built until 40 years after the emperor's death. It is regarded as one of the most important German imperial tombs.
- **Tiroler Volkskundemuseum**, Universitätsstraße 2, open daily from 09:00 to 17:00
Among other things, this museum provides an insight into the art of nativity scene making from the 18th century to the present day

Refreshments stops:

To have a coffee or a tea in the afternoon:

- Café Central, €€: Viennese coffeehouse culture with history (since 1877), Gilmstraße 5
- Café Katzung, €€: classic Austrian dishes as well as coffee and desserts, Herzog- Friedrich-Straße 16
- Café Munding, €€: the Munding family has been running Tyrol's oldest patisserie in the centre of Innsbruck's old town since 1803, Kiebachgasse 16
- Haepinest Café, €: authentic coffee culture with a cosy living room atmosphere: speciality coffees, homemade cakes, midday snacks, Innstraße 2
- Verenas Café, €€, small coffeehouse with a very nice atmosphere and a great variety of daily freshmade and homemade cakes, Leopoldstraße 26
- La Cantina — intermezzo italiano, €, best Italian coffee in town with a very nice atmosphere, Sparkassenplatz 2

For dinner:

- **Fischerhäusl**, €€: restaurant with a historic atmosphere (built in 1753), Tyrolean delicacies. Famous for the mulled wine stall in winter, Herrengasse 18
- **Pizzeria**, €€: pasta and pizza meet top bar culture. Tip: Try out the homemade ginger beer, Bozner Platz 6
- **Pizzeria FARINA** — best pizza in town - right next to the Golden Roof, Herzog-Friedrich-Straße 13
- **Olive**, €-€€: vegetarian and vegan specialities in a charmingly modern ambience right on the Wiltener Platzl
- **Ludwig**, €€: a must of lovers of homemade burgers, also a range of vegetarian and vegan food, Museumstraße 3

Typical student's locations:

- **Machete Burrito Kartell**, €: bar with a living room feel, serving first class drinks and individually made burritos, Anichstraße 29
- **Café Bar Moustache**, €: cool drinks, a wide range of beers and tasty snacks all in a student atmosphere, Herzog- Otto — Straße 8. The locals' first choice!

- **Kater noster**, €: great place! Cafe during the day, events and art room in the basement, bar in the evening (great cocktails, including the „Innsbruck Mule“)
- **Zappa Music Bar**, €: known for its delicious cocktails, Rechengasse 5, near to the university.
- **Uni- Café and Bistro**, €: a different special every day, e.g. burger, wraps, pizza etc., good cocktails, Innrain 55
- **The Galway Irish Pub**, €€: Craft beer and Innsbruck's best Guinness. Local and international beers, Kaiserjägerstraße 4
