

## How you can help CHIFA

There are many ways you can help CHIFA:

## 1. Help CHIFA to grow its membership

- Display the CHIFA logo on your website

## 2. Contribute to the CHIFA community

- Publicise your organisation's activities on the CHIFA forum
- Sponsor a CHIFA discussion on a theme of your choice

- Sponsor a section of the HIFA Voices database (HIFA Voices brings together the experiential knowledge of the CHIFA community and of other HIFA Forums: www.hifavoices.org)

## 3. Provide financial and/or technical support

- Voluntary financial contributions. Supporting Organisations may choose to provide a one-off or annual
  contribution; contributing organisations are recognized prominently on our website and on every
  message that is sent via the CHIFA forum. CHIFA has over 3,000 members from 140 countries (and
  growing).
- *Technical support*: CHIFA has many volunteers worldwide providing help in many ways: publicity and awareness-raising; content analysis; moderation of discussions; database skills; and participation in the CHIFA working group.
